Updates on Projects

Paving Project: \$13,100 to date

- Cost of project, \$50,000
- Able to pitch driveway away from building
- Rebuild/repave driveway from road to employee parking
- Pave new parking lot
- Pave expanded handicap parking

Solar Energy: 17 panels sponsored to date (25%)

- Cost of project, \$45,000
- \$13,500 grant from Focus on Energy
- Cost to purchase one panel and its structure, \$500
- Payback on investment is 10 years
- *In care of our environment*

Elevator/Accessibility Project:

- Cost of project, \$125,000
- Install an internal elevator allowing access to all three floors of the building
- Update our handicap entrance (ramp) door
